Advent Candle Lighting Ceremony

All over the world people make advent rings. They all have five candles, one for each Sunday in Advent and one for Christmas Day. In our Advent Candle Ceremonies our candles will stand for The Patriarchs and Matriarchs of the Bible, The Prophets, John the Baptist and Mary.

Advent Sunday – Patriarchs and Matriarchs

We light this candle to remember Abraham and Sarah and all the faithful people of long ago. These people listened to God and trusted God. They went on a journey to obey God. We are also on a journey of faith, to know God better.

Lord Jesus Christ, light of the world, be with us on our journey through Advent, that we may know you better. Amen.

2nd Sunday in Advent - Prophets

We lit the first candle to remember Abraham and Sarah and all the faithful people. Today we light the second candle to remember Isaiah and Jeremiah and all the prophets of long ago. These people listened to God and gave God's message to their neighbours and friends. They helped people understand what God is like and they shared God's promises for the future. We also watch and listen for God's voice.

Lord Jesus Christ, light of the world, be with us on our journey through Advent, that we may know you better. Amen.

3rd Sunday in Advent – John the Baptist

We lit the first candle to remember Abraham and Sarah and all the faithful people of long ago. We lit the second candle to remember Isaiah and Jeremiah and all the prophets of long ago. Today, we light the third candle to remember John the Baptist. John helped the people to have a new start with God. He baptised them in the river Jordan. John helped them to realise that they should follow Jesus. We too, are followers of Jesus, looking for the signs of his coming.

4th Sunday in Advent – Mary

We lit the first candle to remember Abraham and Sarah and all the faithful people of long ago. We lit the second candle to remember Isaiah and Jeremiah and all the prophets of long ago. We lit the third candle to remember John the Baptist. Today, we light the fourth candle to remember Mary, the mother of Jesus. When Mary was asked to be the mother of Jesus, she said, 'Yes.' When God asks us to do something, may we be ready to say 'Yes'.

The Sharing of the Bread and Wine

Because of the new ways we are currently called to be church we are not able to meet together and receive the bread and wine. The president will receive it on behalf of all of us and we each receive the sacrament spiritually - in a practise known as spiritual reception which has been practised for hundreds of years by those who for many reasons are unable to be at church.

Act of Spiritual Reception

In union, dear Father, with Christian people throughout the world and across the centuries gathered to make Eucharist, hearing your holy Word and receiving the Precious Body and Blood, I offer you praise and thanksgiving. Even though I am exiled from tasting the Bread of Heaven and drinking the Cup of Life I pray that you will unite me with all the baptised and with your Son who gave his life for us. Come Lord Jesus, dwell in me and send your Holy Spirit that I may be filled with your presence. Amen
